<u>Tax/Regulation Ordinance of 2020</u> -- <u>NO!</u> (a "NO" vote would NOT allow the LA HABRA City Council to give permits for cannabis businesses.)

X - CITY OF LA HABRA Citizens Initiative for Preservation of Open Space in La Habra – NO! (Measure X, is Citizen-driven and asking for Voters approval before any development of city "Open Space". BACKGROUND: The city-owned parks, ie "Open Space" already require voter approval before development. Of the 2 remaining "Open Spaces" in LH, the main focus is on 151 acres, currently used as Westridge Golf Course. However, this "Open Space" golf course is "Privately Owned". If Measure X passes, it quite likely could be declared "illegal", if the golf course owners chose to sue.

I [Nancy Sandoval] live in Mission Viejo, and my city recently had a similar situation. However, it was amicably and legally settled when the City of Mission Viejo "PURCHASED" the Casta Del Sol Golf Course. As a Conservative, I believe in PRIVATE PROPERTY RIGHTS. "Open Space" should not just be taken from an owner! MV did it correctly to save their "Open Space" (though I question, should MV should be in the Golf Course business?) I recommend a "NO" on Measure X.

Y - CITY OF LOS ALAMITOS Quality of Life, 911
Police Response, Business/Job Protection Measure -NO! (a "YES" would raise the Los Alamitos Sales TAX
by 1.5% to [raise it to] 9.25%, one of highest in OC. I
know this City is hurting due to COVID, and revenues
are down, but once a TAX INCREASE is approved, it is
NEVER GETS DECREASED.)

Z - City of Newport Beach Addition of Harbor Commission to the Newport Beach City Charter YES! (All conservatives in this city are saying they are supporting)

AA - <u>CITY OF ORANGE</u>, The Trails at Santiago Creek Open Space and Residential Project **YES!**

(I [Nancy Sandoval] have read all I can about this measure, and I think the City Council has done a good job, in trying to meet what Orange citizens have asked. It is time to move on and redevelop this long-disputed gravel quarry, etc.

If approved, approximately 40.7 acres of the site would be designated LOW DENSITY RESIDENTIAL (128 Single Family Resident homes, max). The remaining 68.5 acres of the site would be designated "OPEN SPACE". The Zone Change, if approved, would become part of the city's General Plan.

A 'YES" also provides an additional \$2 million dollars for equestrian and capital improvements, provides \$4.1 million dollars in greenway improvements for Santiago Creek, funds \$1 million dollars for local trail improvements, and provides approximately \$1 million dollars for local traffic improvements. These funds would undoubtedly come from the developers of the 128 homes. If I lived in Orange, they would have MY VOTE.)

BB - CITY OF SAN CLEMENTE, City Council Term Limits -- YES! (a "YES" puts LIMITS on the City Council terms of service to 2 consecutive 4-year terms, w/ ability to again serve after being off the City Council for no less than 2 years?

CC - CITY OF TUSTIN Limited Council

Compensation -- YES! (a "YES" allows the City Code to be changed to allow City Councilmembers to receive compensation of \$600/mo. Tustin is one of the few remaining OC cities who do not get any compensation. I think this is justified, as some councilmembers are not "people of means", and \$600 could pay for babysitters (or whatever!) while they serve the City of Tustin. In comparison, my city Mission Viejo, [council members] receive \$1,000/mo.

DD - <u>CITY OF WESTMINSTER Term Limits</u> -- **YES!** (a "Yes" vote puts LIMITS on the City Council terms of service to a single lifetime term limit of three

(3) four (4) year terms for the offices of Mayor or Council Member, collectively)
