Aliso Viejo City Council: MIKE MUNZING and TIM ZANDBERGEN

Anaheim City Council

Dist 1: **RYAN BALIUS** is definitely the best choice! (Note: Please do **NOT** vote for far-left democrat Ojaala Ahmad.)

Dist 4: 10/5 note - Sadly, there are no conservatives in this race. **NORMA CAMPOS KURTZ**, **is Clearly the BETTER CHOICE** of the two. Norma is pretty probusiness. Her endorsements (though largely liberal to progressive), also include police and firefighters and some more conservative-learning City Councilmembers. *Please do NOT vote for Norma's FAR-LEFT opponent, Francisco Rosas.*

Dist 1: VOTE FOR FRED JUNG as the better of the two candidates. Fred is a moderate democrat and often votes on the correct side of issues. (Please do NOT vote for Matthew Truxaw.)

Dist 2: VOTE FOR NICK DUNLAP!

Dist 4 – VOTE FOR LINDA WHITAKER! Linda is the only conservative in the race! **Please do NOT vote for any of the other three candidates in District 4**, but especially, please: Do **NOT** vote for Democrat Vivian Kitty Jaramillo, and Do **NOT** vote for Scott Markowitz

Area 3: 10/7 note -DZUNG "DAN" NGUYEN is definitely preferable to his opponent. A knowledgeable source tells me that, while he is not a solid conservative, Nguyen is politically "right of center." Please do **NOT** vote for Ana Page – *Ana consistently Votes with the Far-Left Board Members*.

Area 4: Both candidates – Sara Pelly and Armando Perez are FAR-LEFT candidates.

Area 7: There is NO good option in this race. Having said that, I would definitely NOT vote for Stephen GLASS, as he is a FAR-LEFT candidate.
